* This branch in this line descends from John Gee bc 1780 in Bellinge, Lancashire, married Ann _____. The closest lines are Gee of Devon and Gee of Lyme.

** This line changed their surname Gee to Jay. Their earliest known ancestor, Moses Gee, is roughly contemporaneous with but not the same person as Moses5 in the very closely related line above. This Moses married Joannah and died in Pennsylvania. Note that Sussex Co., NJ, adjoins Orange Co., NY. Due to that proximity and the close DNA match, this line is almost certainly related to the descendants of John1 Gee bc 1635 that were living in Orange Co.

This line traces back to Manchester and Chester, perhaps in the late 15C. before the mid-seventeenth century. As we add more members we will better understand how these branches interrelate.

*The earliest known ancestor of this line is David Gee/Jay, born around 1740, married Lydia ____, lived in Montgomery Co, MD. The earliest records show David using the Gee spelling, records between 1780-1810 show him using both Gee and Jay. After 1810, the family seems to have settled on the surname Jay. This line descends through his son William Jay b 1767 m Anne King in Fredrick Co, MD (across the river from Loudon Co, VA) in 1803. Deeds show the couple lived in Loudon Co for a time. They had three sons: Joseph Jay b 1814 (moved to Iowa), Jonathan King Jay b 1818 (to Minnesota) and Stephen H. Jay b 1820 (also to Minnesota). All descendants are believed to have been active Catholics into the mid-20th century. This information is through the courtesy of the Family Association. The genetics show this family being very closely related to the descendants of Charles Gee d1709. His descendants either stayed in Virginia or moved south into North and/or South Carolina. The move from Prince George County north to Maryland would not have been logical. However from Henrico County it would make more sense, providing additional evidence for Charles d1709's descent from Mr. Henry Gee of Henrico.
