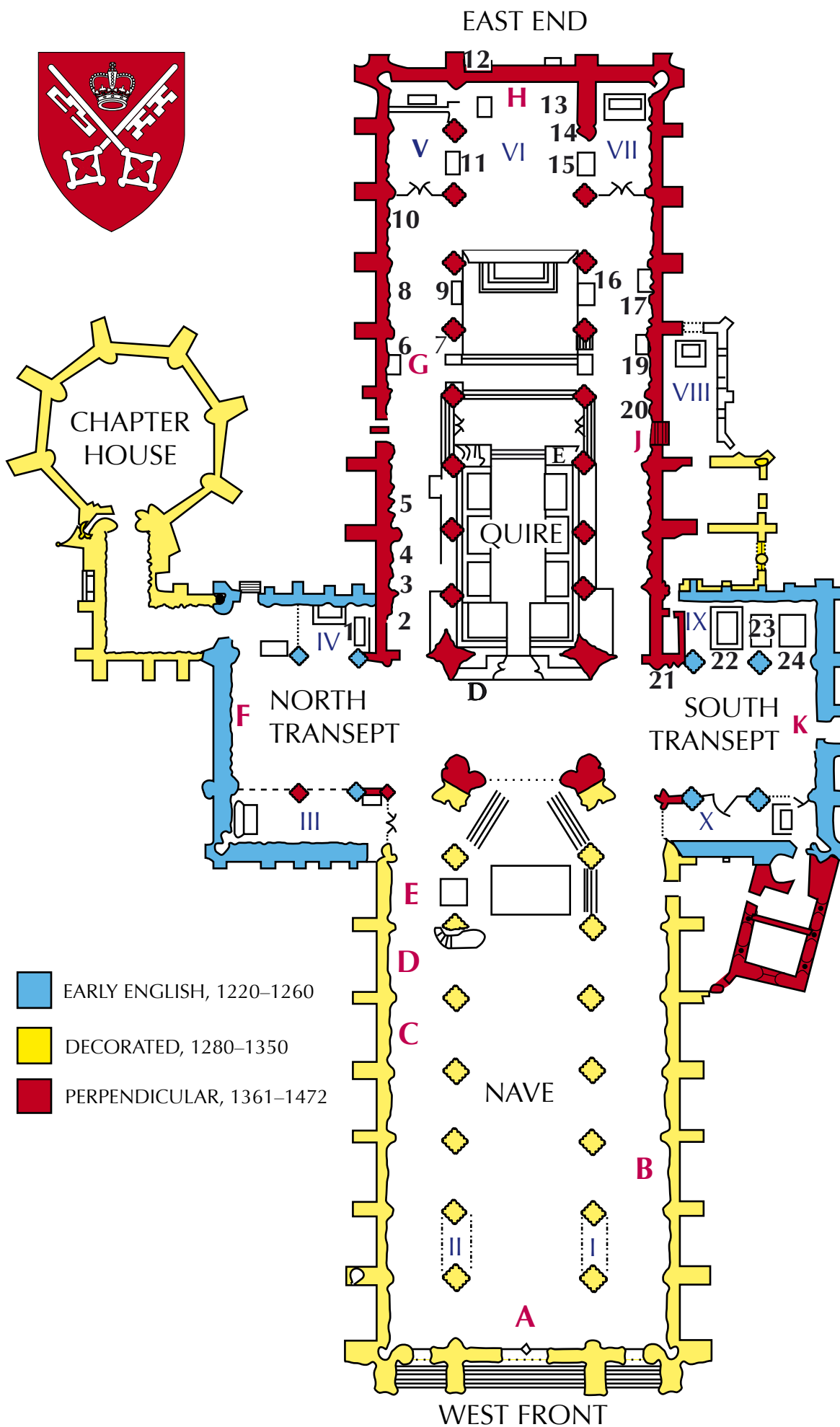


YORK MINSTER MINI PLAN

STAINED GLASS

- A Great West Window, c. 1338
Sometimes called "The Heart of Yorkshire"
- B Jesse Window, c.1310
"Family tree" of Christ emanating from Jesse
- C Pilgrimage Window, c.1320
Note "Monkeys Funeral" scene at bottom
- D Bell Founders Window, early 14th century
Scenes of casting and tuning a bell
- E Heraldic Window, c.1308
Career of Peter de Dene in royal service to Edward I is reflected in heraldry of this window
- F Five Sisters Window, c.1260
Grisaille (grey-green) glass with foliage within geometric patterns.
- G St William Window, c.1414
Scenes from the life of this local saint
- H Great East Window, 1408
Claimed to be the largest expanse of medieval stained glass in the world
- J St Cuthbert Window, early 1440s
Events in the life of popular northern saint
- K The Rose Window, early 16th century
White and red roses of York and Lancaster

- Length: Overall 158m (518 ft)
Nave 84m (276 ft)
East End 72m (236 ft)
- Breadth: Transepts 76m (249 ft)
Nave 42m (138 ft)
East End 39 m (128 ft)
- Height: Central Tower 60m (197 ft)
Western Towers 53m (174 ft)
